- Minutes from February meeting were approved.
- Treasurers report given by Bill Howlin.
- Old/Continuing business:
 - Dues are due by March 31st. April 3rd the gate codes will change. Bill will email the new code out. PLEASE DO NOT SHARE THE CODE!!!
 - Runway reseal project was discussed. Due to the club's low funds it was decided to seek less expensive alternatives including the possibly of the club doing the work.
 - Mike Feitinger reported that the website is mostly finished. A new forum section has been added for discussions and selling/trading items.
- New business:
 - Field security is an issue. The locking of the clubhouse and gate has been an issue lately. If you are the last one to leave the field, be sure to take down the flag and secure in the clubhouse and be sure to lock the building and gate.

MEMBER THOMAS PERRY'S 737!

I was browsing through the April issue of Model Airplane News when I came upon the Pilot Projects page and noticed the Boeing 737 of Thomas Perry! A Motion RC AL37 airliner model, Thomas repainted his in Southwest Airlines colors, specifically the Lone Star scheme on one side, and the Colorado One scheme on the other. You will notice the photos are taken at our field too! Replete with scale chocks, Thomas looks to have done an excellent job. Congrats to Thomas on winning the Pilot Project of the month award in the magazine!



Living in Texas before he moved to Colorado inspired Thomas to create this double scheme on his Freewing 737. He prepped the jet with polycrylic, then painted with Rustoleum spray paint. He notes that the "paint was a little tricky with the base white coat wanting to peel when the masking tape was removed. Peeling the tape very slowly and at a sharp 45-degree angle seemed to work best." Callie Graphics supplied the Texas star, Colorado C. tail decals, and the heart on the belly. Look closely and you'll see chocks

made from 1-inch balsa cut into triangles with .020 safety cable run through the middle and yellow shrink tube for handles.


During the mid 80's, MAS was faced with the dilemma of finding a new flying site as Adams County wanted the club's existing site for the new Dunes golf course at the fairgrounds. During this time a very kind and popular member by the name of Gene Fisher passed away. He was so well liked and deeply missed by the club, they voted to name the field in his honor. From that moment forward the field was officially known as "Fisher Field". A bronze plaque was made with his likeness on it and it is on the current clubhouse building. Historical documents named our current flying site as the "new Fisher Field". Next time you are at the field take a look!




The Fisher plaque on the clubhouse.


When you get a chance, visit the new website for the club! A lot of thought was incorporated into placement and content.




There is a member area with important notices and access to the Forum! The gate code is the password for this area.
