SAFETY OFFICER-KEN ROBERTS

Flight line Safety by Mike Feitinger

Filling in for Ken this month I wanted to take a moment to talk about safety on the flight line. I know most members are conscientious about being safe, announcing intentions loudly so others can hear them, and being observant of what's going on on the runway and infield while you are flying. However, I have observed some complacently with safety procedures concerning the flight line at the field.

Let's start with some basics. When you are flying your airplane, there is a designated "safe area" to fly in. It starts at the "flight line" which is the line at your feet that extends left and right of you to infinity (like all the way around the world). You should <u>never</u> fly "behind" the flight line (the side towards the pits). This includes doing turn around maneuvers.

Another area of concern is the announcing "coming out!", "taking off", "landing!" and "**on the runway!**". People *have been hit* by aircraft while retrieving their disabled airplane in the infield!! The other pilots flying simply "were not aware" that there was someone walking on the runway. You should not be taking off, landing, or doing a low pass when there are people on or near the runway area! If you are in the air, climb up and away from the persons in the area and wait. If you must land, only do so when it is safe by coordinating with the individuals retrieving their aircraft. If you're on the ground, don't takeoff. Wait until the persons on the infield are back safely in the pits. This may require you to shutdown your engine and wait.

Which brings up situational awareness. When you are flying your aircraft, try to be aware of others and what they are doing. This can help you anticipate a potential conflict.

You may ask, why do we need to observe these rules? Obviously we want to mitigate the risk of having someone get hurt by a rogue aircraft. By "practicing what we preach" we greatly reduce the possibility of having an accident from an aircraft that is in the wrong area at the field. If you have a lazy attitude about following the rules and guidelines at the field, you greatly open yourself up to risk.

Be safe out there!
